Prayer Of Repentance

Based on Psalm 51

**Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love;
according to your great compassion blot out my
transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me

Silent Reflection

Ash Wednesday Prayer

Ashes are a fitting symbol for this day, Lord. Ashes call to mind Endings ... the end of unclear thinking, insecure faith, wavering commitment and, finally, the end of the struggle between death and life. Time passes. Erosion and rust methodically and silently accomplish their work. Treasures and trophies tarnish. Things which we thought were so important become transparent. Everything returns to dust. Yes, ashes are a fitting symbol for this day, Lord.

Lord God, by your grace, help us to see that endings make possible New Beginnings. As we encounter ashes along the way of life, call to mind our need to return to you, the source of new beginnings. Through your forgiving love, restore us to wholeness and empower us to serve you diligently. Amen.

Imposition of the Ashes

Ashes are a sign of repentance and humility. They remind us of our total dependence on God. Before we approach to receive the sign of the cross with ashes, let us reflect on the meaning of this action:

Do you accept responsibility for your personal sins?

“I do.”

Do you accept responsibility for that evil in the world which your apathy and indifference have allowed?

“Yes”

Do you desire to return to the Lord with your whole heart, and to seek his forgiveness and strength?

“I do.”

Do you believe in the mercy of God, which is constant and more vast than all the evil in the world?

"Yes, I do believe."

Take now, then, these ashes, and return to the Lord with your whole heart.

All may receive “ashes”.

"Remember you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Acceptance & Absolution

O God, our sins have turned that which is living into dust and ashes. Accept the ashes of our heartfelt repentance and breathe new life into our animated human dust, that we might stand eternally in your most holy presence. Amen.
